Community

Crown Point, NY is a quiet town located on the western shore of Lake Champlain, at the base of the Adirondack Mountains. The town encompasses an area of approximately 82 square miles, having a population in 2010, of approximately 2,024 people.

As a small, rural community in Essex County, NY, Crown Point is rich in history. Founded in 1786, Crown Point is an original town within the county and home of the *Crown Point State Historic Site* (featuring the ruins of two forts from the colonial wars) as well as the *Champlain Memorial Lighthouse*. Crown Point also contains the *Lake Champlain Bridge*, providing easy access to The State of Vermont. Located just west from the center of town is the hamlet of Ironville. The *Ironville Historic District* is registered on the *National Register of Historic Places* and is the home of The *Penfield Homestead*.

Curriculum

CPCS operates using a block schedule consisting of 18 —20 minute blocks, with most classes taking place for 40 minutes.

CPCS grading system is based on a 100 point scale.

An average of : 90 and above is High Honors 85-89.9 is Honors 65 is Passing

Exceptional Honors are awarded to students in Grades 6-12 earning a 90 or above GPA in *all* classes within a marking period.

Grade Point Average (GPA) is unweighted.

Students are evaluated on a quarterly basis.
