Normally, a \$183 donation will feed one child throughout the school year through the food we purchase from the Regional Food Bank of NE NY. But with the International Paper matching grant, every dollar you donate will be doubled. Now, a donation of \$183 will feed two children on the weekends for an entire school year. All non-grant donations received between September 2nd, 2019 and November 30th, 2019 will be eligible for the match.
